

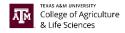

General updates and discussion about what we are currently doing and what we have planned for departmental IT service migration for the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. - Tim Ramsey


- Have migrated about 800 people so far and have about another 800 waiting on migration. 700 people have not responded
 - Many of the people that have no been migrated have reasons as to why (scheduling conflicts, etc.)

Item 4: Teaching Labs & Classrooms

Description:

Handoff - Enterprise Technology Committee working with Instructional Media Services at TAMU IT Academic Services. Purpose to determine management and support options for departmental teaching labs and classrooms across the college and potential hurdles. - Tim Ramsey.

 Already engaged IT academic services through their instructional media services team for taking over management of classrooms



- Departments own their classrooms, management of these classrooms were done by staff in department or teachers/faculty
- Asked IMS what they could do since they already have a management system in place
- Currently 67 classrooms in teaching labs across the college, IT academic services and IMS only support 23 of them, so Tim is keeping the conversation going to see what can be offered
- IMS does have some good benefits- they have contracts with vendors that can build out these spaces that can help with getting computer systems, projectors, cameras
 - Team built within CoALS will work with IMS for authentications and modernizing a lot of the classrooms, many of the classrooms are WAY behind. Many don't have the cameras anymore to record lectures
- Tim- Currently have \$100,000 to begin funding this, but will be building a
 matrix to approach each one of the departments with what they need to
 contribute to help bring this to fruition
